

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## **Building the Team**

#### **Inclusiveness**

- Drawn from target study population.
- Maximize breadth of experience. Consider
  - Severity of the medical condition
  - Socio-economic profile
  - Cultural beliefs
  - Geographical setting , ...

## **Building the Team**

#### Recruitment

- Various strategies: Draw from existing pool, forums, organizations,...
- Assess suitability of partnership:
  - Patient Profile
  - Study needs and patient's ability to contribute
  - Researcher's Experience and Openness to PE
  - Patient's Understanding and Experience
  - etc.

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## **Values and Principles**

### Foundational principles of working together

- Develop a shared Vision and Purpose
- Team values. Consider
  - Equity, honesty and transparency,
  - Appreciation of diversity, and respect for others and their view
  - Fostering of Mutual Learning
  - Co-Building

## **Clarity of Roles and Expectations**

### **Co-Develop Roles**

- Alignment with patient preferences
- Alignment with study goals
- Clarity on:
  - Goals
  - Expectation
  - Time commitment
  - Activities
  - •••

# **Materials and Training Resources**

- > Identify areas requiring of training/guidance
  - Patient: Content area, Research Process, ...
  - Researcher: Approaches to PE, Strategies for optimizing PE
- Range of learning resources
  - "How-to Guides"
  - Scientific Literature
  - Webinars
  - Workshops
  - Mentorship

## **Project Management**

- Timelines and deliverables
- Approach to Decision Making
  - Eliciting contribution
  - Equity and transparency of the decisions
  - Accountability
- Facilitating Participation
  - Addressing information needs
  - Creating a safe environment
  - Select adequate venue and time
  - Facilitating discussions
  - Consider barriers
  - ..

- Sustaining Engagement
  - Compensation
  - Encouragement
  - Maintaining contact during downtime
- Budget

# **The Study - Planning**

Developing the Research Question

Alignment with patient priorities

Study Methods

Feasibility, Acceptability, Scalability, ... Examples:

- Enhancing recruitment
- Minimizing disruption to patients and stakeholders
- Creating relevant/appropriate study material (e.g. information sheets) Defining study outcomes,
   PROMs and PREMs
- Selecting/adapting tools
- Etc.

### The Study - Conducting

Feasibility, Acceptability, Scalability, ...

Recruitment and Data Collection

Value of relating to target community. Examples:

- Recruitment strategies and Recruitment
- Trust-Ease of contact for data collection
- Data Analyses and Interpretation

Valuable insight. Influence of patient experiential knowledge. Examples:

- Analytical lens
- Awareness of potential confounders/effect modifier
- Explaining variations across settings

### The Study - Knowledge Translation

#### Relevance, Impact, Breadth, Uptake

- Dissemination Strategy
  - The approach, target audience, and message
  - Opportunities within patient communities
- Dissemination Activities
  - Direct patient involvement in knowledge exchange activities
  - Active roles: co-creation and ownership of data
  - Consider: academic conferences, public consultations, policy forums, Public communication activities: workshops, seminars, roundtables, webinars, public lectures, etc

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## **Evaluating the Partnership**

#### Formative Evaluation

- Experience of all members in partnership
- Authenticity of engagement
- Potential areas to address
- Tools: Public and Patient Engagement Evaluation Tool (PPEET) by McMaster's University; Patients Canada, Team built,...

#### Summative Evaluation

- Experience of all members in partnership
- Authenticity of engagement
- Impact of contribution on study conduct

# **Building the Team**

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- Patients already engaged
- Demonstrate appropriateness of team profile alignment with study, breadth of experience,...

**Identify Participants**: Identifying patient applicants in [as a Knowledge User] supports SPOR's principle of patient involvement and provides formal recognition of patient applicants (e.g. acknowledgement in CIHR's funding decisions notifications) as active participants in the project

**EVALUATION** Patient engagement and partnership: a. Appropriateness of patient engagement mechanisms and the extent to which they align with the <u>SPOR Patient Engagement</u> <u>Framework</u> and <u>engage across diverse population groups</u>.

**EVALUATION** Patient engagement and partnership: a. **Appropriateness of patient engagement mechanisms** and the extent to which they align with the <u>SPOR Patient Engagement Framework</u> and **engage across diverse population groups**.

**EVALUATION** Patient engagement and partnership: b. **Strength** of stakeholder **engagement**, including the engagement of patients, policy makers and other knowledge users

**Attach Other Application Materials**: In a maximum of three (3) pages total, describe the:

- Patient engagement plan
- Policy Maker engagement plan
- Operational plan to ensure feasibility

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**EVALUATION** Patient engagement and partnership: c. **Strength** of the project **team**, including the extent to which all **jurisdictions** and their representatives on the application are appropriately and meaningfully involved

### **Clearly Articulated Roles and Expecations**

Priority Outcomes Partnership Inclusiveness Support Respect Co-Build

- Describe: co-creation of roles; appropriate planning and commitment from all (written documentation of roles); role and the duration of the commitment for each; alignment of role with expertise/experience, availability, and interest.
- ➤ Where applicable, demonstrate the engagement of patient partners throughout the study period.
- State explicitly how that contribution will contribute to the decision making.
- ➤ Describe the contingency plan should changes in team structure be required.

#### **Clearly Articulated Roles and Expecations**

Patients must play a **key role** on the research team; a minimum of one Principal Applicant or Principal Knowledge User must be a patient

#### Attach Other Application Materials: Patient written statement

Key participants that fall in the patient/family representatives/informal care providers stakeholder group are required to provide signed written statements (**maximum two (2) pages each**) describing their relevant lived experiences that details their fit for this role in the context of the application

#### Attach Other Application Materials: "Participant Table"

In a table format, list all key participants, the type of participant they are (NPA, PA/co-APP, PKU/KU), the sector that they are covering (research, policy or clinical (the patient participant will not have a sector) and the member network that they represent. Each participant must have a description of what each brings to and gains from the proposal.

**EVALUATION** Patient engagement and partnership: c. **Strength of the project team**, including the extent to which all jurisdictions and their representatives on the application are **appropriately and meaningfully involved** 

### **Materials and Training Resources**

- Explain how the training needs of the patients and the researcher undertaking patient engagement research have been assessed, the orientation provided, the resources harnessed, the training activities planned.
- Demonstrate the intent to access SPOR resources on patient engagement

Applicants are encouraged to work with the <u>SPOR SUPPORT Units</u>. Successful applicants are expected to engage when appropriate and possible, with other SPOR-funded entities to strengthen collaboration and maximize usage of available resources.

**EVALUATION** patient engagement and partnership: e. **Evidence of leveraging existing resources and platforms**, including SPOR SUPPORT Units.

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#### **Approach to Decision Making**

- Describe the governance structure and decision making process the team has adopted.
- Clearly demonstrate how the patient partners will contribute to the decision making process
- Explain how the process will be transparent with accountability measures built in


- ➤ Describe the strategies co-developed to promote meaningful patient engagement throughout the study.
- Describe how communication strategies are adapted/adaptable; how the contribution will be facilitated; how known barriers pre-empted and emerging issues identified and addressed;

#### 1. Planning - Explain how the project:

- Was developed with patient partners
- Addresses patient priorities
- Will make important contribution to patient outcomes
- 2. Conducting Provide examples of how the patient partner contribution has informed specific components, e.g.:
  - Recruitment strategy
  - Analyses

3. Knowledge Dissemination: Explain the role of the patient partner in the planning and execution of KT
